Vision

Cambodian children and youth will have the knowledge, skills and attitudes to reach their full potential and to actively participate in the development of a prosperous community and society.

Value

Our values, which underlie our beliefs, behaviors and actions are based on the Buddhist values:

- Sacca (Honest, Responsible, and Independent)
- Khanti (Patient, Resilient, Communicative)
- Kattannu (Grateful, Caring, Collaborative, Respectful and Creative)

Mission

- Prepare early learners (ages 4-6) for their future education by providing a quality, holistic Early Childhood Education (ECE) that includes a strong health and nutrition component.
- Provide a model for educational programs that reflects the values of Green Umbrella.
- Offer training and educational youth programs (YP) that build the knowledge, skills, values and leadership needed to strengthen and promote the right of Cambodia youth.
- Building community awareness and capacity for growth and development by involving parents, stakeholders and the broader community in GU's educational programs.

Green Umbrella focuses on two main projects:



Early Childhood Education (ECE)

- **Green Umbrella Pre-School** Provides K1 and K2 education to 121 students, and follows up when they enter Grade 1 in local Public Schools
- **Community Pre-School** GU trains Community School teachers and donates provisions and supplies



Youth Program

268 students participated in 21st century skills; 42 students completed the Robotics Course and 45 students joined the Youth Camping weekend

Main Projects

Green Umbrella coordinates additional two projects to help the wider community:

Khel Chey Library

Improves reading skills through community outreach and activities



Additional Projects

Pot Sar Health Center

Provide affordable medical treatment to mothers, children and the community



1 Early Childhood Education: Green Umbrella Pre-School

The Green Umbrella Pre-School addresses the demands of early childhood education to enable Cambodian children to embark on a lifelong learning journey. GU caters for children in rural areas, underprivileged children, and those from low and middle-income homes

Main Focus Areas

1. Encourage enrolment in ECE
2. Provide Professional development for teachers
3. Offer teaching and learning resources
4. Educate on nutrition, hygiene, child health, and safety topics
5. Improve kindergarten infrastructure
6. Involve parents, families, and the whole community
7. Follow up with students at primary school at grade 1
8. Community outreach



Facts and Figures

- **121 students were enrolled** in GU kindergarten in 2023. There were 4 K1 classes and 4 K2 classes
- **Teachers were trained for a total of 120 hours.**
- **We followed up with 46 students** in Grades 1 and obtained positive feedback on their academic performance.



Selection & Enrollment Process

- ✓ We announced the ECE program to 11 local villages, providing handouts with information on enrollment
- ✓ Parents submit the enrollment form with their children’s birth certificate, date of birth, and poverty identification card (if applicable)
- ✓ GU accepts students between 4-5 years old. Students are admitted on a first-come-first-serve basis; after the deadline for registration passes, a lottery is held for late enrollments until we reach full capacity
- ✓ We continue to support children in rural areas, the underprivileged, and those from low and middle-income homes.
- ✓ Green Umbrella staff visit households with poverty identification cards to provide extra support.

1 Early Childhood Education: Community Pre-School

- The Community ECE Program aims to share GU skills and experience with other ECE schools so that more young children can get a great start to their education when in their kindergarten years

Main target areas

1. Build and strengthen the capacity of Community teachers via Professional development
2. Increase the effective communication and encourage parental participation
3. Educate on nutrition, hygiene, child health, and safety topics
4. Promote and strengthen standard criteria for community kindergartens



Facts & Figures

- Teacher’s attendance in training >80% across 12 Community schools
- Post-test of teacher’s knowledge improved 50%-70%
- Kindergarten teachers practice improved 50%-70% with 340 Community K1 & K2 students
- Parent’s attendance in promotion >80%
- Standard criteria of community kindergarten improved 80%

1 Early Childhood Education Case Studies



Sok Chea (mother) and Socheata, 5 years old

Socheata joined K1 class last year when she was four years old. Socheata’s mother says her knowledge and behavior has improved after one year with GU. She has started using polite languages with her family and friends. Her mother also shares that she herself feels happy and proud knowing her daughter is studying at Green Umbrella.

Sokha (mother) and Liza, 4 years old

Liza joined K1 class last year when she was nearly four years old. Her mother says Liza has become more friendly and respectful with her family and friends. Liza is very active and loves to play with other student and wishes to continue studying at Green Umbrella.



2 Youth Program

The Youth Program aims to enable youths to **create a vision for themselves**, to **develop knowledge, skills and behaviors required for the 21st century**, and to **engage in entrepreneurial development for family economic and social progress**.

In 2023, GU worked with 307 students (171 girls) in Sok An Chambok Secondary School including 76 alumni students (55 girls).

2 Youth Program Case Studies

Kimheak is a 15 years old grade 9 student in Sok An Chambok Betmeas secondary public school. She joined the GU Youth Program in March 2023, participating for many months.

Kimheak scored over 81% in final tests and shares “I learnt about critical thinking, creativity and innovation in the course on 21st Century Skills. Although these subjects are new to me, I think they are really useful for students and youths. The skills enable us to know more on how to think critically, how to be creative and innovative in our study and other areas of our lives”.



Tomy is 14 years old and a grade 8 student at the same school as Kimheak.

He is the youngest student on the robotics course, and loves learning all about this technical topic. Tomy participated successfully in the robotics course for 12 weeks in 2023. Moreover, he already facilitated twice in project exhibitions during the year.

Tomy said “I’m actually very interested in technology. I was really excited to attend the robotics course and especially loved participating in the projects. I want to build my own robotics for use in daily living and business. I think it would be good if this project expands to other schools”.

3 Khel Chey Library Project

- There are currently 3,500 books in our Kel Chey Library and in 2023, 1,100 new books were donated
- The project aims to cater for 20 to 30 visitors or readers a day, or 7,300 to 10,950 annually, to read in the library
- Upon opening in February 2022 to December, 10,650 readers checked in to read in the library and 4,275 borrowed books to read at home
- There were 29 readers in the library each day, which is close to the upper end of our daily goal
- Between January and December of 2023, there were 22,020 readers and 2,180 borrowers who took books home. This equates on average to 60 visitors per day
- This implies that the number of visitors in 2023 increased by 200% from 2022, compared to the 2023 goal of 11,070
- GU is very proud to be part of this successful project helping and encouraging all Cambodians to embrace the importance of books and reading




4 Pot Sar Health Center Project

The purpose of this project is to enhance the effectiveness of the medical team’s treatment service to patients, especially for mothers giving birth (pre and post-natal care), babies and young children and the elderly. The facility has separate maternity wards, prenatal and postpartum care, and pediatric and eldercare sections. GU also funded new equipment to support each of these wards.




Funds received during 2023 by Project









Khel Chey Library Project




Pot Sar Health Center Project


